Huron Perth & Area Ontario Health Team (HPA-OHT) Patient/Family/Caregiver Participation Process

Phase One:

- 1. Complete **Inquiry Form.**
- A Patient/Family/Caregiver Committee Member will <u>contact</u> you and discuss next steps.
- **3.** Meet with Patient/Family/Caregiver Committee Member for a **Conversation**: Getting to Know You.
- 4. **Notification** of Participation (letter)

Phase Two:

- 5. Follow up contact with a Patient/Family/Caregiver Committee Member
- 6. Provide a **biography**/About Me communication
- 7. Meet your mentor, if applicable.

Phase Three:

- 8. Participation begins, attend meetings, review documents, etc.
 - a. Participate in monthly or quarterly **meetings**
- 9. Complete a satisfaction **survey** annually
