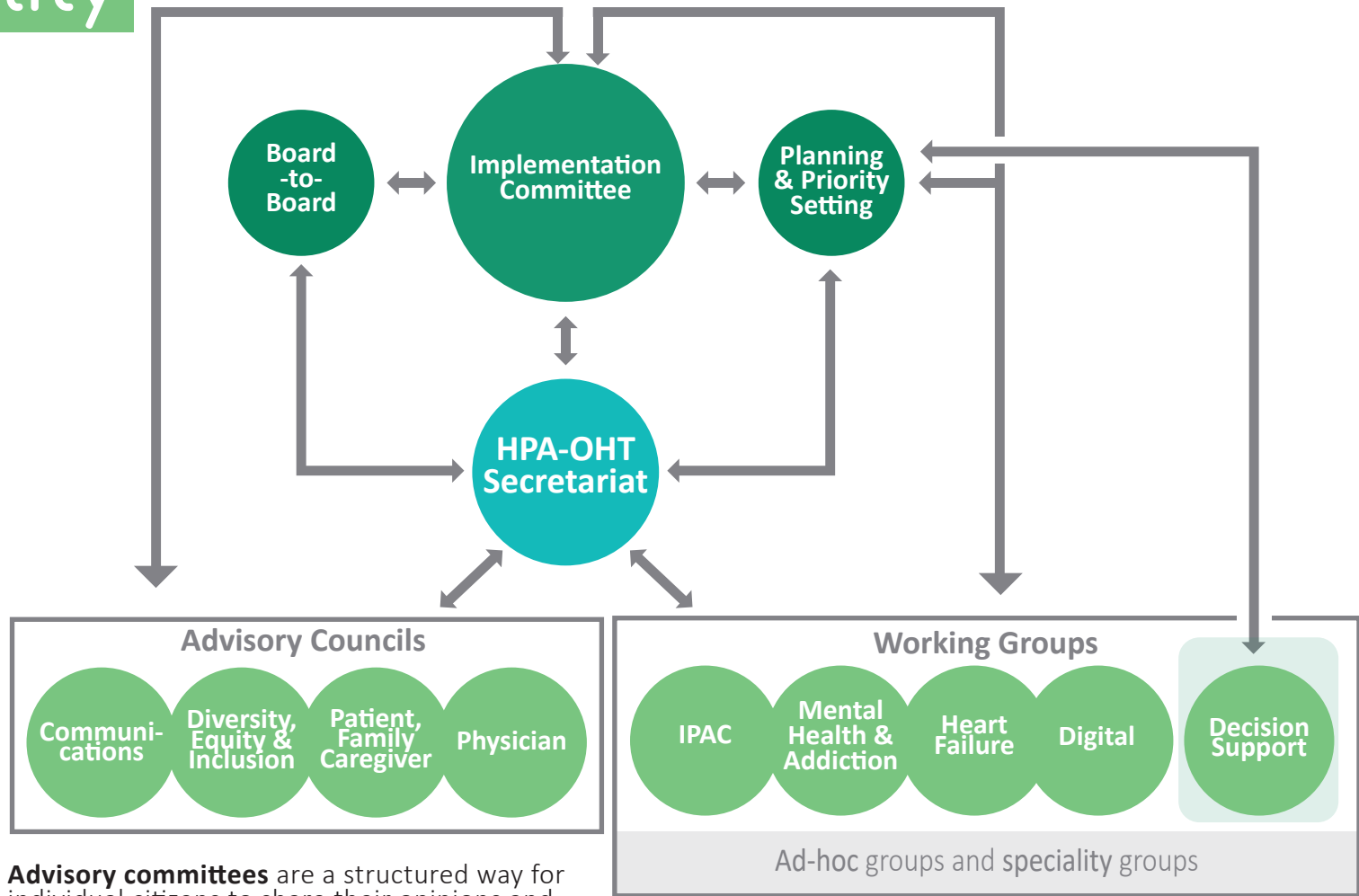


Accountability Structure

HPA-OHT's vision is a sustainable, people-driven system that strives to provide a positive experience for all. The Accountability Structure depicts HPA-OHT groups comprised of Formal Members, Collaborating Partners, Physicians & Specialists, Patient/Family/Caregiver partners and invited experts. The Structure outlines transparency and the tenets of responsible governance that are demonstrated through the quality and reliability of information — financial and non-financial — provided to stakeholders, employees, and the public.



Advisory committees are a structured way for individual citizens to share their opinions and perspectives, study issues, and develop recommendations in a focused, small group structure.

A working group is a group of experts working together to achieve specified goals. The groups are domain-specific and focus on discussion or activity around a specific subject area.
